ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY/OTHER POLICE AGENCIES

The Los Rios Police Department has primary law enforcement jurisdiction for all criminal incidents occurring on-campus. This includes incident investigation, follow-up and resolution. Los Rios Police Officers work in conjunction with outside agencies, such as the Sacramento Sheriff's Office, the Sacramento Police Department, and the local fire and emergency medical services.

The Los Rios Police Department is a full-service police agency staffed seven days a week, 24 hours a day. We employ peace officers, campus safety officers, campus patrol officers, and student patrol officers. Their specific powers and authority are:

Peace Officers:

The peace officers have statewide police authority, full powers of arrest and are vested with law enforcement powers pursuant to California Penal Code Section 830.32. Peace officers enforce local, state and federal laws both on and off campus. Their police authority includes concurrent

jurisdiction with municipal and county agencies on adjacent streets and in the surrounding community. Peace officers meet ongoing training requirements as mandated by the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST), as well as additional training designed to meet the needs of the college community. Law enforcement duties and responsibilities of our peace officers are comparable to local police departments and sheriff departments in your home communities.

All Other Officers:

Campus safety officers, campus patrol officers, and student patrol officers are all agents of the district. They each have the same powers of arrest as a private citizen.

REPORTING CRIMES OR OTHER EMERGENCIES

Procedures for Reporting a Crime or Emergency

Community members, students, faculty, staff, and guests are encouraged to immediately report all crimes, emergencies, suspicious activity and any other public safety related incidents to the Los Rios Police Department at (916) 558-2221 or ext.2221 from campus phones.

Crimes or Emergencies on-campus

Contact the Los Rios Police Department at (916) 558-2221 or ext. 2221 from campus phones. You may also dial for community based emergency assistance from a standard on-campus phone by dialing 9-9-1-1. Use these numbers for reporting on-campus fire, police and medical emergencies. Police Communications Center (PCC) personnel are trained to respond appropriately to emergencies of any nature.

There are many “blue light” emergency telephones located throughout the campuses which ring directly into the PCC of the Los Rios Police Department. These auto-dialing phones may be used to summon emergency police, fire or medical assistance.

Crimes or Emergencies off-campus

The Los Rios Community College District does not have off-campus student housing or student organization facilities. The off-campus emergency telephone number is “9-1-1.” Use this number from pay phones and all off-campus locations for community-based fire, police and medical services. Refer to your local telephone directory for further information.

Non-emergencies on-campus

Contact the Los Rios Police Department at Ext. 2221 or (916) 558-2221. You may also use the “blue” phones on campus for non-emergency services.

Confidential Reporting Procedures

The Los Rios Police Department encourages the prompt reporting of crime to the Police Department. Because police reports are public records under state law, the Los Rios Police Department, in some circumstances, cannot hold reports of crime in confidence. Confidential reports for the purposes of inclusion in the annual disclosure of crime statistics can be made to other campus security authorities (see listing of Campus Security Authorities in this document). The purpose of confidential reporting is to comply with the reporter's request for confidentiality, and yet allow the Los Rios Police Department to maintain accurate records to ensure the safety of the community.

FACILITY ACCESS AND SECURITY

The Los Rios Police Department provides 24-hour patrols of district buildings, property, and parking lots. Officers investigate crimes, alarms and suspicious incidents and persons, and provide responses to medical and fire incidents on the premises.

Campus facilities and buildings are generally open to the campus community, visitors and guests Monday - Friday from 7AM-11PM, and as certain special events dictate. Staff is encouraged to lock any doors not in use. Custodial and College Police staff regularly checks the security of the buildings.

Campus shrubbery, trees and other vegetation are routinely trimmed and artificial lighting is maintained with safety issues in mind. The campus community is encouraged to report unsafe conditions, safety concerns, exterior lighting issues or telephone malfunctions to Campus Operations, Facilities Management or the Los Rios Police Department.

The Los Rios Community College District does not have campus residences.

HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY

Alcohol Policy

The Los Rios Community College District complies with the Drug Free Workplace Act of 1990 and the Higher Education Act Section 120a.

Excessive use of alcohol and other drugs is a serious health problem in itself, but alcohol and drug abuse can also contribute to a host of other physical and mental health problems such as unwanted pregnancy, violent behavior, HIV infection and other sexually transmitted diseases and psychological depression.

Students found in violation of the district's alcohol, drug and weapons policies may be subject to academic probation suspension or expulsion. Parents or

guardians may be notified about any disciplinary violation involving alcohol or a controlled substance which has been committed by a student who is under the age of 21.

The possession, consumption or transportation of alcoholic beverages on Los Rios Community College campuses or in district owned facilities is generally prohibited as a matter of institutional policy. Los Rios Community College District and the Los Rios Police Department are very concerned about the abuse and over consumption of alcoholic beverages by students. It is the belief of the Los Rios Police Department that education as well as strict enforcement of local, state, and federal laws will help to control the abuse of alcohol on campus. Education regarding the dangers of alcohol abuse will provide students the opportunity to make informed choices regarding its use, while strict enforcement will help to ensure the safety and security of the campus community. It is important to note that the Los Rios Police Department will investigate and prosecute, to the fullest extent of the law, any violation of local, state, or federal laws pertaining to the use, possession, or sale of alcohol. Successful prosecution can lead to fines, incarceration in county jail, or incarceration in state prison, depending on the violation that was committed.

Visit the campus health and/or counseling office for alcohol abuse prevention programs offered by the district. The health and/or counseling office provides culturally sensitive information about alcohol and other drugs to our diverse campus community.

The use of alcoholic beverages must be in compliance with state law and is strictly limited to those persons 21 years of age or older. The possession, transportation, and/or consumption of alcohol by individuals less than 21 years of age is strictly prohibited and enforced. Alcoholic beverages may not be transported or consumed on district property.

This is formalized in District Policy 2443.

Controlled Substances Policy

The Los Rios Community College District complies with the Drug Free Workplace Act of 1990 and the Higher Education Act Section 120a.

The Los Rios Police Department strictly enforces state and federal laws, as well as the district's zero-tolerance policy, for the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession or use of illegal drugs on district property or at any district-sponsored event off campus. Violators are subject to criminal prosecution and/or disciplinary action.

This is formalized in District Policies 2441 and 2443.

Weapons Possession

State law prohibits the possession of weapons, all firearms, fireworks, explosives or any dangerous weapons on-campus. Refer to Penal Code sections 12020, 626.9 and 626.10. Violators are subject to criminal prosecution and/or district discipline.

The Los Rios Community College District supports the federal guideline (37.007.1Ed Code) that prohibits handguns on campus. The possession of a firearm on district property is prohibited and strictly enforced. The only exception for persons legally authorized to possess firearms on district property. Persons in violation of this regulation will be subject to criminal and/or disciplinary action.

This is formalized in District Regulation 2441.

If you observe a firearm or other weapon on campus, contact the campus police immediately at (916) 558-2221 or Ext. 2221, press zero, or dial 9-911.

Workplace Violence

The district is committed to creating and maintaining a working, learning and social environment for all employees, free from violence. The campus has zero tolerance for violence against any member of the workforce, other persons in the workplace, or property.

This is formalized in District Regulation 6164

Sexual Harassment

Sexual Harassment is prohibited on-campus and is defined as unwelcome sexual conduct; sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and repeated derogatory sexual remarks. Violations by employees are subject to disciplinary action ranging from oral warnings to dismissal from employment.

To make an inquiry or complaint against a district employee, contact the Los Rios Police.

To make an inquiry or complaint against a district student, contact the Los Rios Police Department.

This policy is formalized in District Regulation 2424

SEXUAL OFFENSES AND OFFENDERS

Sexual Assault Prevention Programs

Crime prevention pamphlets are available in the Los Rios Police Department lobby. The Los Rios Police Department has officers available for the Orientation Program, to inform prospective students and their parents of available police services and programs. Similar presentations are available for new employees and international students as well. Sexual Assault Workshops are presented for the students and staff each semester. Safety talks are provided upon request, for any office, organization or classroom as needed on campus.

If You Become the Victim of a Sexual Assault

- Get to a safe place.
- Notify the police agency having jurisdiction of the location where the crime or attempted crime occurred.
- Seek medical attention whether or not you intend to notify the police, even if you have not been seriously physically injured. A medical examination is important to check for sexually transmitted diseases, other infections, injuries, and pregnancy.
- Help preserve evidence. Physical evidence is paramount in helping to prosecute assailants. Evidence generally must be collected within 72 hours of the assault and only by a certified medical facility upon the request of a law enforcement agency. To preserve evidence after an attack, you should not change your clothes, bathe, shower or take any other personal hygiene action before contacting police. If it becomes absolutely necessary that you change your clothes, each item should be packaged separately in a paper bag. If oral contact took place, do not brush your teeth, use mouthwash or smoke. Do not straighten up the crime scene.

Civil Prosecution

Victims can consult an attorney about initiating a suit in civil court for damages against the assailant. The purpose of a civil suit is to compensate the victim for the wrong done to them. A civil action can be brought against the assailant regardless of the decision to criminally prosecute.

District Disciplinary Procedure

If the crime occurred on campus and the assailant is a student, besides criminal and civil action, campus administrative action may be initiated. A student charged with sexual assault may be sanctioned by the LRCCD. Sanctions may include, but are not limited to: probation, counseling, suspension or expulsion.

If the assailant is a faculty or staff member, besides criminal and civil action, they may be subject to disciplinary action under applicable personnel policies or collective bargaining agreements. Report suspected employee misconduct to the Los Rios Police Department.

The Los Rios Community College District is committed to providing judicial and disciplinary proceedings that are supportive, sensitive, expedient, and respectful to each individual's rights.

Both the accuser and the accused are entitled to the same opportunities to have others present during a disciplinary proceeding, and both must be informed of the outcome of any institutional disciplinary proceeding brought alleging a sex offense.

"Megan's Law"

Persons convicted of certain sexual offenses are required by law to register with the law enforcement agency where they live. If the person is attending or employed by the Los Rios Community College District, they are required to register with the Los Rios Police Department also.

Procedures for Sex Offenders on Campus

You **MUST** register at the Los Rios Police Department at the time of enrollment AND/OR employment. You can only do this by appointment. You **MUST** notify the Los Rios Police Department upon your decision to not attend AND/OR not work for the Los Rios Community College District.

Students and/or Employees required to register **MUST** contact the College Police Office of **EACH** campus they will attend classes at.

SECURITY AWARENESS AND CRIME PREVENTION PROGRAMS

The reason crime happens is well known. Crime happens because there is a *CRIMINAL* to commit the crime, a *VICTIM* who can be victimized by the criminal, and the *LOCATION* or *OPPORTUNITY* for a crime to occur.

You can reduce the likelihood of being the victim of criminal activity if you take away the *OPPORTUNITY* for the criminal to make you his victim.

Students, staff, and visitors need to take responsibility for the safety of their persons and property. Everyone should also do their best to help others with this responsibility. The Los Rios Police Department has several ways to help you learn more about safety.

Crime prevention pamphlets are available in the Los Rios Police Department lobby. The Los Rios Police Department has officers available for the Orientation Program, to inform prospective students and their parents of available police services and programs. Similar presentations are available for new employees and International Students as well. Safety talks are provided upon request, for any office, organization or classroom as needed on campus, based on the availability of a police presenter. The intranet as well as printed material is used by the Los Rios Police Department for the dissemination, department presentation, crime prevention tips and newsworthy information.

CRIME ALERT (TIMELY WARNINGS) BULLETINS

The Los Rios Police Department is committed to promoting a safe campus environment and believes that a well informed community is an integral component to achieving that goal.

Crime Alert Bulletins will be issued by the Los Rios Police Department when a crime of a serious nature occurs or one that is considered to represent a threat to students or employees.

A threat is defined as any act or potential act that places the campus community, at large, in continuing risk or peril, as a result of a crime(s) against persons or serious felony. (Example: Weapons of mass destruction, threats with a firearm, a bomb threat with specific information, sexual assault by stranger, or other egregious acts)

Crime Alert Bulletins will be distributed to the campus community using various mediums of communication. The type of event or situation will be reviewed by the Los Rios Police Department and the Public Information Officer to determine the most effective method to distribute the crime bulletin information.

When there is a possible public safety related “threat” to faculty, staff, and students on campus, the Los Rios Police Department and the Public Information Officer will make reasonable efforts to notify the faculty, staff and students:

- Faculty, staff, and students will be notified by voicemail and e-mail. Crime Alert Bulletins will be available on the Los Rios Police Department’s Web site.
- The Public Information Officer will notify the media, as appropriate, in order to inform the campus community.
- To notify students, faculty will be asked to make announcements in their classes. Notices may be put at the entrances to major student-gathering places or in plain view on buildings that are directly impacted by the event (Learning Resource Center, Student Services, Administration Building, Lecture Halls, Physical Education...etc.)
- The Los Rios Police Department and the Public Information Officer will determine whether the notice of threat is to be made on campus only or disseminated to off campus sources.

- Situations will be assessed on a case-by-case basis, with great weight given to the Los Rios Police Department's assessment of the total situation, including the best use of resources.
- Notices will be posted/ distributed within 24 hours of the event, or as soon as practical, depending on the severity of the event, resources, and factual information gathered.
- Notices will be removed in a timely fashion after the event has subsided or the potential for danger is gone.

DAILY CRIME LOG ACCESS

The Los Rios Police Department maintains a daily crime log for the most recent 60-day period. The log is open for public inspection during the normal business hours of 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., Monday – Friday. Log entries older than 60 days can be obtained by request within 2 business days.

ANNUAL DISCLOSURE OF CRIME STATISTICS

Preparation of the Disclosure of Criminal Statistics

The Los Rios Police Department is responsible for gathering and disclosure of crime statistics. The annual security report for the Los Rios Community College District includes statistics for the previous three years concerning reported crimes that occurred on campus, in certain off-campus buildings or property owned or controlled by the Los Rios Community College District and on public property within, or immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus.

In accordance with mandated reporting requirements, information concerning the monitoring and recording of any criminal activity in which students engaged, at off campus locations and/or within student organizations that are officially recognized by the district, are gathered from local police agencies. These agencies include any city, county, state, or federal agencies that may have relevant information. These agencies are sent a letter yearly encouraging the reporting of these crimes or incidents. The letter is sent out at the beginning of each calendar year. The statistics provided are published in the disclosure.

The Los Rios Police Department is aware that crimes may go unreported to law enforcement and encourages employees of the Los Rios Community College District, who have significant responsibility for students and student activities, to report to the Los Rios Police Department any crimes that they may have become aware of in their daily contact with students. As a reminder, annually a letter is sent out encouraging the collection and reporting of crimes or incidents. Certain Deans, Directors or other administrators, Faculty Advisors and Student Academic Advisors, Student Activities Advisors and Coordinators are all included in the yearly notification. These individuals are designated as Campus Security Authorities. Faculty (except for Advisors), Physicians, Counselors and Clerical Staff are examples of employees who are not required to report as Campus Security Authorities under the Clery Act.

The report also includes institutional policies concerning campus security, such as policies concerning alcohol and drug use, crime prevention, the reporting of crimes, sexual assault and other matters. In addition to the Los Rios Police Department web site (<http://crc.losrios.edu/~police/>), you can find this information printed in Course Catalogs.

Criminal Offense Statistics

The following statistics are being provided as part of the Los Rios Community College District's commitment to safety and security on campus and comply with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act (Clery Act). The tables list crimes occurring on-campus, in non-campus areas, and in public areas adjacent to campus.

On-campus refers to crimes committed on the campus property, **non-campus** refers to crimes committed at all Outreach Centers and properties that are leased or rented by the District for instructional purposes. As required by the Clery Act, crimes listed for **non-campus** properties only include crimes that occurred in the specific areas used by the LRCCD and specific time periods utilized by the LRCCD. It does not include public property. **Public property** refers to those areas immediately adjacent to and accessible from the Colleges, including streets, sidewalks, parking facilities, parks etc. It does not include private residences or businesses.

These statistics include data received from other law enforcement agencies in response to annual requests. Crime statistics reported as occurring "on-campus" include incidents reported to the Los Rios Police Department as well as incidents reported to other campus officials, including but not limited to directors, deans, judicial affairs, advisors to students, student organizers, and athletic coaches. Reports received from campus officials may have been submitted anonymously and may result in criminal statistics higher than those reported to the Federal Bureau of Investigation by the Los Rios Police Department pursuant to their reporting guidelines.
