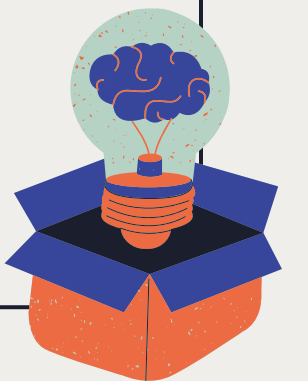
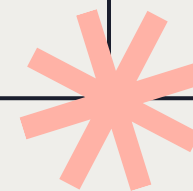
ASCRC is

Student Senate

Be a REPRESENTATIVE entity that participates in the shared governance of the College and the Los Rios Community College District.	Advocate for the common interests of students at the local, state, and federal levels by encouraging student responsibility as granted by Assembly Bill 1725 and all other applicable state and federal laws.	Provide a conduit of information for communicating with, securing input, representing views and reporting back to the students.	Promote student involvement and activities that reflect the diversity of the campus community and foster cultural awareness and acceptance.	Provide a mechanism for the appropriate allocation of ASCRC resources.

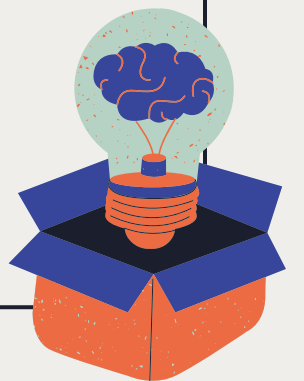
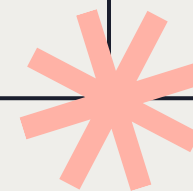

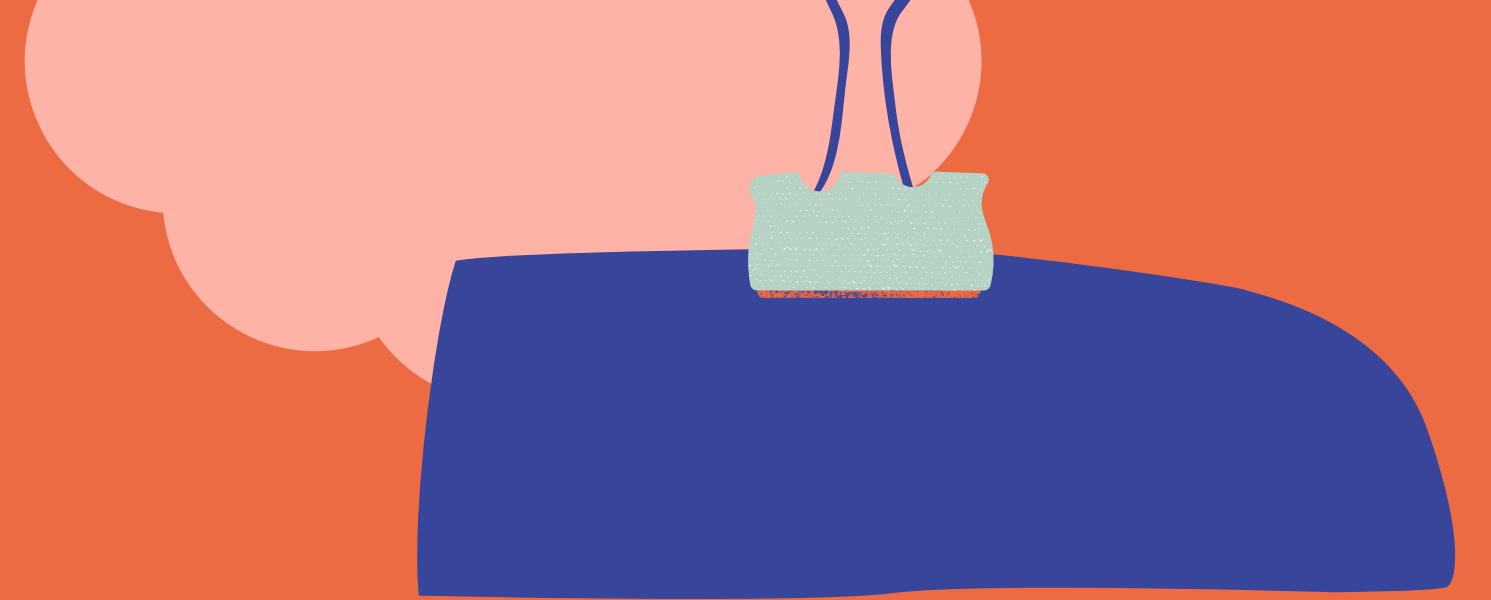

Student Senate Roles

President

Presides over all Student Senate meetings

Official representative of CRC students, Los Rios District, and the community

Vice President

Stands in for the President in the event of the President's absence

Facilitates communication between the Los Rios Community College District and shared governance committees

Treasurer

Prepares the annual budget

Makes recommendations to Council on expenditures

Chairs the Finance Committee

Director of Legislative Affairs

Serve as chair of the Legislative Committee

Organize any lobbying efforts on behalf of ASCRC at local, state, and federal levels

Secretary

Responsible for keeping minutes during meetings and uploading agenda

Senator

They represent the CRC student population at large

Must be a member of at least one shared governance committee

(roles include, but are not limited to duties listed above)

CAEB Roles

Commissioner

Presides over all CAEB meetings.
Acts as representatives of CAEB by voting on issues

Vice Commissioner

Acts as presiding officer in absence of the Commissioner
Serve as CAEB alliance to Senate.

Director of Finance

Presents the budget and incentive points overview
Keeps records of all finances

Secretary

Responsible for keeping minutes during meetings and uploading agenda

At-Large Representative*

Attend all CAEB meetings and be prepared to vote, assist events.
Be familiar with the issues and present proposals for events

Events Coordinator

Coordinate all Clubs and Events Board activities and events.
Serve as the Chair of the Events Committee.

*non-election position; must be appointed after elections

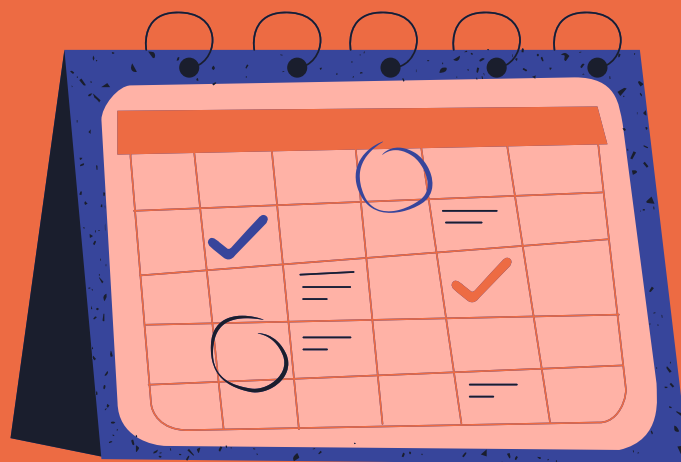
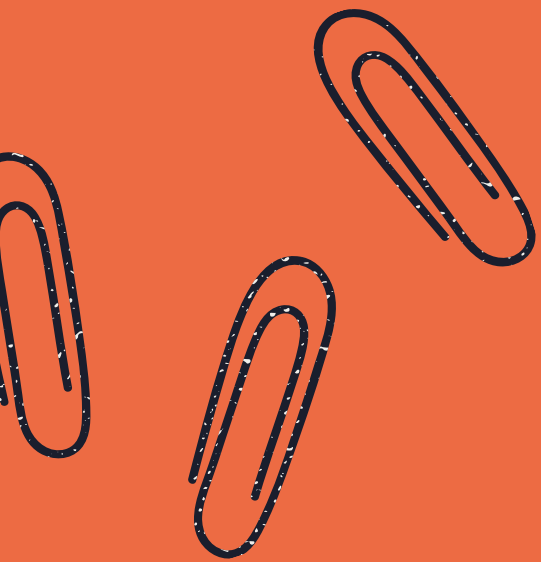
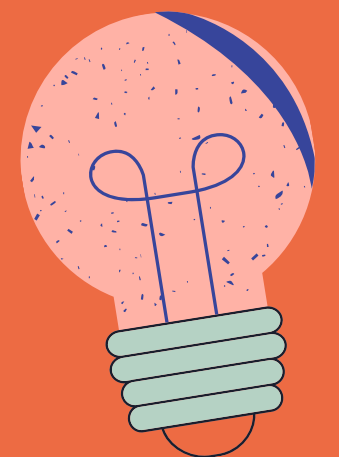
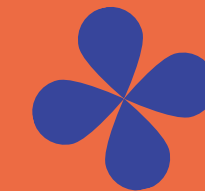

March 2: Candidate Application Open at 8 am	April 21-22 at 8:00 AM-11:30 PM - Online Elections & Rock the Vote Event
March 31: Application Deadline at 5 PM	April 23: Supplemental Final Campaign Expenditure Forms due electronically by 3 PM
April 2-10: Pre-Campaign Orientations	April 23: Deadline to remove all campaign materials and postings
April 14-22: Campaign Period	April 24: Election results posted, upon verification
April 15: CRC Candidate Forum at 12 PM in L-106 (Center for Inclusion and Belonging) Friday, April 17 th : Campaign Expenditure Forms due electronically by 3 pm	Late May: Oath of Office July 1: Effective date for new officers

Campaigning

Campaign material may include: flyers, social media posts, etc.

Student Life and Leadership Center can print up to 30 black/white flyers for ASCRC candidates.

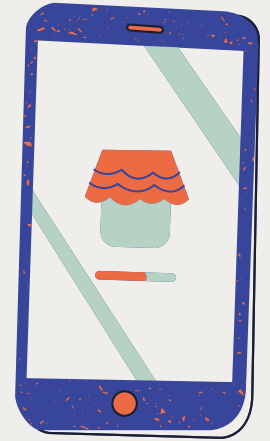
All flyers and social media posts must be approved by ASCRC Advisor Kayla Anaya.

Can campaign in classrooms only with permission from your professor.

Campaigning must focus on YOU. No negativity is allowed towards other candidates.

ASCRC candidates can spend a maximum of \$120 on campaign- must keep all receipts and email Kayla with expenditure form before and after elections.

Candidates can't use food, money, gifts, etc. as part of campaigning.

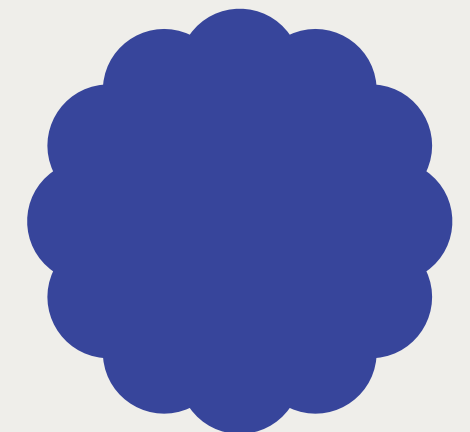
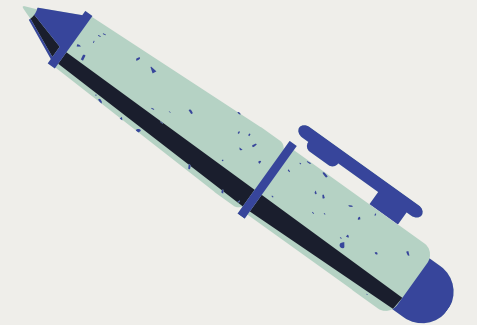
